



Student Excellence Scholarship

Continuing students in our on-campus diploma and bachelor degree programs who have achieved excellence in an academic or artistic discipline during their studies at LCV are eligible to receive the LCV Student Excellence Scholarship recognizing that work. These scholarships are for applicants who have been recommended by a faculty member or program director.

The LCV Student Excellence Scholarship has two streams: one for academic excellence and one for talent. They have different application requirements, adjudication criteria, and scholarship amounts as described below.

Who can apply?

- Any continuing student registered full-time who has been recommended by a faculty member or program director

Scholarship Assessment Criteria

Applicants will be assessed based on the following criteria:

How to apply for the Academic Scholarship Stream

Ensure you send a complete package (readable scan copies in PDF format) with your full name and student ID in the subject line of your email.

- 1) **A completed and signed scholarship application form**
- 2) **A letter of recommendation from an LCV faculty member or program director**
- 3) **A copy of your official LCV transcript**
- 4) **Deadline:** your completed scholarship package must be submitted no later than four weeks prior to your program start date and send to **scholarships@lasallecollegevancouver.com**

Student Excellence Scholarship: Talent Stream

Applications will be assessed, and scholarships allocated up to 20% of the annual, full-time tuition based on the following criteria:

Creativity	Demonstrate creative aptitude in their chosen area of study, ideally involving multiple modalities.
Community Spirit	Demonstrated willingness to be proactively involved with local, national or international community activities and causes, as well as the LaSalle College Vancouver community.
Social Responsibility	May include: contributing to community and caring for the environment; promoting sustainable design; solving problems in peaceful ways; valuing diversity; building relationships; demonstrating global citizenship.
Values	Share the values of the LCI Network: Commitment, Initiative, Quality, Sharing, and Mutual Consideration.

How to Apply for Talent Scholarship Stream

Ensure you send a complete package (readable scan copies in PDF format) with your full name and student ID in the subject line of your email.

- 1) A minimum 250-word personal narrative statement discussing your talent and aspirations, as well as explaining how your portfolio shows your development (PDF or Word files only with your name, student ID and word count included).
- 2) A letter of recommendation from an LCV faculty member or program director
- 3) Digital portfolio of your work. Please include 3-4 pieces of work. These could be images of work compiled in one file or a link to your website.
- 4) Completed & Signed Application Form.
- 5) Submission Deadline instructions: In order to be considered, your completed scholarship application package must be submitted no later than four weeks prior to your program start date to: **scholarships@lasallecollegevancouver.com**.

Scholarship Terms and Conditions

- The scholarship award will be applied to tuition fees and disbursed quarterly for the upcoming quarter onwards.
 - Students must be registered in a full course load of 12* or more credits each quarter to be eligible. Exceptions to the course load requirement are made if a student has a documented learning accommodation requirement.
 - Deferral of or withdrawal from studies may result in forfeit of the remainder of the scholarship award (or the entire award if the studies have not yet commenced).
 - Students must maintain good academic standing, with a minimum 3.0 GPA each quarter. Failure to meet academic obligations may result in forfeit of the scholarship award. Any tuition or fees associated with repeating a failed subject will be the responsibility of the student.
 - By accepting the scholarship, the recipient must agree to take part in activities and events as outlined in, but not limited to, the Student Responsibilities section of the application.
 - Scholarships are competitive and are awarded at the discretion of LCV.

Student Responsibilities

Scholarship recipients are expected to contribute to the LaSalle College Vancouver community, assist prospective students, and get involved with events. Recipients may be required to:

- Participate in school activities such as Open House, Orientation, Portfolio Show, etc. as a Student Ambassador.
- Support the promotion of the institution by participating in testimonials, website content, social media, local marketing events, and other initiatives.
- Support the Admissions Department and Program Directors when necessary for on-campus events, tours, alumni events, and other duties as required.
- Support initiatives pertaining to the LCI Foundation.
- Students are expected to provide up to one hour of time for every \$100 awarded.
